RE: 2023 FEE SCHEDULE FOR PUBLIC FACILITIES AND

PROGRAMMING

KEY ISSUE

This report recommends fee changes for Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (TRCA) public facilities and programming. These fees are reviewed and amended annually as stated in the background of this report.

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT the 2023 Fee Schedule for Public Facilities and Programming be approved as set out in Attachment 2, effective February 1, 2023;

AND THAT TRCA's member municipalities and the Province be notified and provided a copy of this report.

BACKGROUND

At Board of Directors Meeting held on January 28, 2022, Resolution #A253/21 was approved as follows:

THAT the 2022 Fee Schedule for Public Facilities and Programming be approved as set out in Attachment 2, effective February 1, 2022;

AND THAT TRCA's member municipalities and the Province be so notified.

Staff annually conduct a review of the Fee Schedule for Public Facilities and Programming and recommend changes as required. This review considers the value provided to customers through TRCA programs and facilities, current market conditions and comparable fees imposed by other public authorities such as local municipalities, school boards, the Province of Ontario at provincial parks, and other Conservation Authorities. Any fee disputes are reviewed at the park or program level with site staff who can resolve them. Proposed fee changes combined with support from our government and agency partners provide necessary revenue required to ensure TRCA can continue to provide safe, well-maintained parks and inclusive recreation and education experiences to diverse communities while protecting natural and cultural assets.

As an outcome of the fee schedule review process, TRCA staff propose increasing fees in several different areas to enable necessary cost recovery for park and facility access and program delivery.

RATIONALE

The proposed changes to the 2023 Fees for Public Facilities and Programming, including comparisons to 2022 fees, are provided in Attachment 1. The proposed 2023 Fee Schedule for Public Facilities and Programming is provided as Attachment 2. Attachment 3, titled Access to TRCA Public Facilities, summarizes programs TRCA has implemented to alleviate barriers to participation and encourage access to TRCA's public facilities and programming.

Fees for access to parks and programs provide the funds required to operate and maintain conservation parks and assets, as well as provide community programming and natural-science and cultural heritage education for area schools and school boards. Ensuring that TRCA facilities and programs are accessible and safe for public enjoyment is of great importance to the millions of people who live near and visit TRCA greenspaces.

With COVID-19 operating precautions, certain attractions such as pools or large special events were restricted in 2020 and 2021. In 2022, staff were able to re-open facilities and support special events once again. Park and trail use has shown an increase over the last several years, particularly for walking and other passive park activities. Increased use, severe weather impacts such as the May 21, 2022, windstorm, and the resulting increased requirements for park and trail maintenance coupled with aging infrastructure has resulted in increased operating costs within the Conservation Parks and Lands Division in particular. As a result, proposed fee increases include inflation costs and, in some cases, minor over inflation adjustments to ensure that increasing costs do not have a negative effect on maintenance and our ability to keep parks and amenities safe, clean, and green for public enjoyment.

With communities around Conservation Parks and Lands managed properties continuing to grow, the demand for access to greenspace and passive park use also increases. As landowners and managers of conservation areas, TRCA is obligated to ensure a standard of care for our lands. Providing a clean and safe environment for all visitors is an integral part of why we need to collect fees. The proposed fee changes will assist TRCA in covering costs to provide accessible and enjoyable greenspace and programs for public enjoyment.

Financial sustainability of TRCA's public use facilities and education centres remains of paramount importance given the ongoing impacts of COVID-19 to operations. To this end, fee increases coupled with new program growth enables TRCA to continue to remain responsive to community interests and needs while ensuring that TRCA facilities and programs remain viable into the future.

With the above in mind, TRCA will continue to undertake a feasibility study of paid parking at TRCA-managed Conservation Lands in 2023. TRCA is part of a pilot project in the Township of Uxbridge where paid permit parking is required at select trail head parking lots in Uxbridge. The Region of Durham is also participating in the project. Associated revenue from parking will be used for much required ongoing maintenance of trail head parking areas and the trails themselves. The feasibility study will inform TRCA on options for expanding paid permit parking to other TRCA-managed trail heads. A new parking fee category will be required for implementation of any new paid

parking location. Any additional fee categories to facilitate this new cost-recovery program for parking will be provided to TRCA's Board of Directors for consideration and approval as appropriate.

In addition to paid parking at trail head parking areas, TRCA piloted a per-car parking fee in 2022 at Petticoat Creek Conservation Park. Rather than collecting general admission for each individual patron arriving in a vehicle, a single vehicle rate was applied. This pilot alternative to per person rates helps encourage local visitors to enter the park for free via active transportation means or through carpooling. The pilot was a great success and significantly sped up gate entry times thereby alleviating lengthy line ups at the main entry gates resulting in improved access for emergency vehicles and an overall improved visitor experience. The parking rate is in line with local municipal parking for recreational or tourism areas and the net revenues worked out in line with revenues collected through per person admissions in previous years. This parking initiative made entry much faster and alleviated line ups onto the municipal streets. With the pilot at Petticoat being such a success, in 2023 we have adopted that process for Petticoat and will pilot the same process at Heart Lake and Boyd Conservation Parks where patrons experience similar long lineups that spill out onto busy municipal roads. We expect similar success in shortening visitor wait times, improving emergency vehicle access, encouraging active transportation, and ultimately providing an improved park experience.

School-based education and community and family programing across TRCA has been, and will continue to be, impacted by COVID-19. The proposed fee adjustments mitigate rising inflation costs and provide funds required to operate education centres and programs safely while ensuring fees remain competitive within the sector. Staff have developed fee ranges for program offerings to provide both flexibility and accountability in covering program delivery costs while also reflecting the value of the program to our participants. Fee ranges allow staff to adjust programs and fees in-year based on demand and market conditions, thereby ensuring TRCA can continue to respond to the growing demand for programs and services within the communities we serve.

FINANCIAL DETAILS

The projected revenues generated by the proposed increase in fees are approximately \$350,000, which will be used to address the financial pressures associated with operating the facilities.

DETAILS OF WORK TO BE DONE

Following Board of Directors consideration and approval, TRCA will notify its partner municipalities and the Province of the changes to the 2023 Fee Schedule and the updated fee schedule will be utilized for finalizing the 2023 budgets.

Conservation Parks and Lands together with Education and Training staff will work with internal Corporate Services partners, including Marketing and Communications and ITRM, to ensure all required updates are adopted in updated publications and materials, including the 2023 Fee Schedule for Public Facilities and Programming on the TRCA public website and online booking and reservation systems.

Attachment 3: Access to TRCA Public Facilities

BACKGROUND

Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (TRCA) recognizes and promotes the full participation of all residents in educational, cultural, and recreational programs and services, as per TRCA's Admittance Policy. Through a variety of offerings, TRCA's public-use facilities engage diverse user groups including persons with disabilities, financially challenged individuals and groups, children, and Active Transportation users.

TRCA continually strives to promote inclusion and access for all. The following outlines several programs that TRCA has implemented to help alleviate barriers to participation and encourage greater access to nature-based cultural and recreational experiences.

Programs with regional public libraries

TRCA's library pass programs, in partnership with CVC, provide City of Brampton, City of Vaughan and Town of Caledon Public Library members access to Conservation Parks Memberships. Memberships are available for "checkout" at public libraries and offer users free access to TRCA and CVC parks and attractions, promoting inclusivity, encouraging nature-based experiences, supporting healthy communities and increasing awareness of parks.

Black Creek Pioneer Village (BCPV) participates in both Toronto Public Library's Museum + Arts Pass program and a similar program with Vaughan Public Library which provides free access to Toronto museums and cultural attractions. Individuals may borrow a pass from participating library branches which provides them with free general admission.

Canoo (formerly known as the Cultural Access Pass program)

TRCA participates in the Institute for Canadian Citizenship's *Canoo* program, which celebrates multiculturalism by offering new Canadian citizens free general admission to Canada's natural and cultural treasures. As participating attractions, TRCA Conservation Parks, Kortright Centre for Conservation (KCC) and BCPV welcomes Canoo members every year.

Active Transportation Policy

TRCA continues to work with municipal and industry partners to formalize additional trail access points to Conservation Areas and to expand trail connections. This encourages more people to enjoy nature-based recreation more often and helps people stay active.

Free Admission Programs

At all TRCA public-use facilities, free general admission is offered to toddler ages 0-3. Through the Ontario Teacher's College membership, teachers receive free admission at all facilities. Participants of Vaughan Culture Days and Doors Open Toronto receive free admission to the KCC and BCPV, respectively. In October, the KCC also offers a Family Adventure Walk in the Forest where families can participate free of charge and children are encouraged to participate in "forest school inspired" activities. TRCA also waives admission fees for support persons accompanying visitors with disabilities to alleviate barriers to experiencing culture and nature-based outdoor recreation.

TRCA continues to explore new opportunities that help people engage with nature. Inclusivity and accessibility are priorities at our facilities. Staff is committed to expanding current initiatives and providing diverse communities with even more opportunities in years to come.

BCPV also provides free admission to newcomers in both the Professional Access into Employment (PAIE) and Newcomer Youth Green Economy Project (NYGEP) programs.

Community Learning Activities

TRCA provides community learning activities in local greenspaces and neighbourhoods to support local engagement in nature-based activities. These programs are focused on improving opportunities for local residents and families to participate in free activities that help improve local knowledge about ecosystems

and watersheds while contributing to ecological health. These programs are supported through municipal funding and government and private grants and free to the end user. Information on Community Learning events and activities is available on TRCA's events webpage.

Environmental Leaders of Tomorrow

TRCA works with local schools to provide integrated learning experiences for students from eligible schools to access the Environmental Leaders of Tomorrow program at one of TRCA's three overnight centres. Focused on improving student knowledge, understanding and action related to the environment, the Environmental Leaders of Tomorrow program provides subsidized experiences for classes from schools in priority areas of TRCA's watersheds. This program is supported through municipal funding and private grants. TRCA works closely with area school boards to identify schools that would benefit from this program.

Update and naming of the Nature Centre at Bruce's Mill

KEY ISSUE

To provide an update to Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (TRCA) Board of Directors on the establishment of The Nature Centre at Bruce's Mill and to request approval of renaming of the current Pancake House/Chalet to The Nature Centre at Bruce's Mill.

RECOMMENDATION:

WHEREAS Bruce's Mill Conservation Area is an established and vibrant public use facility with a strong history of programming and community-based partnerships;

AND WHEREAS the population of Stouffville and nearby communities including Richmond Hill, Aurora and Markham continues to grow rapidly, enhancing opportunities for community engagement within TRCA public use facilities;

AND WHEREAS expanded public and school-based educational opportunities aligns with the recommendations of TRCA's Outdoor Education Task Force and the work of the Natural Science and Education Committee (NSEC) to enhance student access to out-of-classroom learning related to natural science, conservation and the environment:

AND WHEREAS the proposed name of The Nature Centre at Bruce's Mill meets TRCA's Naming of Assets Policy in that it reflects the historic name of Bruce's Mill Conservation Area:

THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED THAT the report on the establishment of The Nature Centre at Bruce's Mill be received;

AND FURTHER THAT the existing Chalet/Pancake House at Bruce's Mill be renamed as The Nature Centre at Bruce's Mill.

BACKGROUND

Established in 1963, Bruce's Mill Conservation Area has a strong history as a destination for picnics, hiking, group functions, summer camps and other recreational activities, with over 180,000 visitors annually. Since 1965, Bruce's Mill has also played host to one of the Greater Toronto Area's (GTA) largest and longest running maple syrup festivals, with guests participating in maple syrup tours and demonstrations that highlight this unique aspect of Canada's natural resources.

In addition to the Sugarbush Maple Syrup Festival, Bruce's Mill also hosts a number of

public, not-for-profit and private third-party partnerships that enhance and augment the program and service offerings at this site. These include the following:

- The Community Safety Village of York Region;
- Town of Stouffville Summer Camps;
- YMCA Summer Camps;
- TMS Summer Camps;
- Tree-Top Trekking;
- Stouffville BMX;
- David Fritz Golf Lesson and Camps;

Building on this strong history, TRCA staff have developed new and expanded four season programming at Bruce's Mill that extends the reach of TRCA's community learning and school-based education activities through the establishment of The Nature Centre at Bruce's Mill. This new centre would provide new opportunities to engage with residents, schools, community groups and others within this area of TRCA's watersheds, which is currently underserved as it relates to these types of activities.

Programming will focus on the natural and cultural heritage of Bruce's Mill and the surrounding community and integrate multiple local community groups and partners into the overall delivery framework. A particular emphasis will be placed on integrating diverse populations and perspectives into the programming at Bruce's Mill to accurately reflect the diversity of the local municipalities and their demographic make-up.

Engagement of local schools will be aligned with the work of TRCA's Natural Science and Education Committee and integrate with the strategic recommendations of the Outdoor Education Task Force. Learning activities through partnerships with local school boards will leverage TRCA's strong history in this area. This history includes engaging over 150,000 students annually through TRCA's other education facilities and centres and linking the science of conservation and the environment with Ontario Ministry of Education Curriculum.

RATIONALE

Bruce's Mill Conservation Area in the Town of Stouffville on the southern edge of the Oak Ridges Moraine and in the heart of York Region. It is located 8 minutes from downtown Stouffville and just north of Markham, Richmond Hill, and Aurora. The conservation area occupies 108 hectares (267 acres) in the Rouge River watershed and hosts a diverse ecosystem, including 1.2 hectares of wetlands and 44 hectares of deciduous, coniferous, and mixed forest.

The population of Stouffville is projected to grow from 52,000 residents in 2021 to 91,600 residents by 2051 and the City of Markham population growth is expected to almost double, with 619,000 residents by 2051, up from 338,500 in 2021. This dramatic population growth in both the Town of Stouffville and City of Markham presents an opportunity to expand programming significantly both to meet current resident needs, but to also prepare for future and expanded interests from new residents as they settle in nearby communities.

TRCA's Education and Community Learning team has a long-standing history of

delivering environmental and outdoor education. Since 1953, TRCA has utilized multiple sites engaging students and families through a variety of approaches to learning in the out of doors. TRCA has an expert staff complement that is trained, certified and experienced in leading meaningful and safe outdoor environmental education experiences. TRCA has the appropriate facilities, equipment, grounds, trails, and infrastructure in place to accommodate safe group learning in the outdoors.

FINANCIAL DETAILS

Provisions have been made within the draft 2023 TRCA Operating Budget for expanded programs and services, along with associated start-up costs, including signage, website upgrades, booking systems and other supporting infrastructure.

DETAILS OF WORK TO BE DONE

To acknowledge and recognize the launch of The Nature Centre at Bruce's Mill, TRCA staff are planning a formal ceremony during the Sugarbush Maple Syrup Festival to officially open and launch the new centre. Relevant local elected officials, TRCA Board Members and other dignitaries will be invited to participate in the official opening of The Nature Centre at Bruce's Mill.

Approval and endorsement of new policy.

KEY ISSUE

To seek approval and endorsement of Toronto and Region Conservation Authority's (TRCA) Fleet Decarbonization Policy as drafted.

RECOMMENDATION:

WHEREAS TRCA has a general goal of reducing Greenhouse Gas (GHG) Emissions generated annually through operations;

AND WHEREAS TRCA's Fleet is a significant contributor to the GHG emissions generated annually by TRCA;

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED THAT the Fleet Decarbonization Policy be endorsed and adopted to assist in the reduction of GHG emissions of TRCA.

BACKGROUND

All TRCA Divisions have a demand and requirement for Fleet resources to deliver projects and programs throughout TRCA's jurisdiction. While the demand for Fleet across the divisions varies pending workload and type of Fleet required, all Divisions have an impact on the volume of GHG emissions generated through the operation of TRCA's Fleet.

TRCA's Fleet is comprised of a combination of On-Highway, Off-Highway and Marine Fleet, of which TRCA owns and operates approximately 110 licensed motor vehicles including passenger vehicles, light-duty, and medium-duty vehicles. TRCA's Off-highway equipment fleet is primarily comprised of agricultural and or construction/industrial based equipment consisting of approximately 220 units and includes but is not limited to farm tractors and implements, small scale construction equipment, including onsite office trailers or storage equipment, dewatering equipment, off-road utility vehicles, and property maintenance (snow and ice removal, mowers etc.). Additionally, the Marine Fleet totals approximately 35 units and primarily consists of specialized vessels for fisheries monitoring, near shore aquatic surveys, inland lake portable classrooms, and utility work boats.

For the most part, the TRCA Fleet primarily operates on petroleum-based fuels, i.e., gasoline or diesel. To date TRCA's adoption of alternative fuels or zero-emission vehicles has been in line with available market technologies from manufacturers, which have primarily existed in On-highway passenger vehicles in the form of hybridization, plug-in hybridization and or electrification when and where feasible. These hybridization

technologies account for approximately 20% of the On-Highway Fleet inventory.

In 2021, the Government of Canada (Canada) announced new targets for light-duty cars and passenger truck sales to consist of 100% Zero Emission Vehicles (ZEV) by 2035, with an interim target of 2030 for 60% ZEV sales. These timelines accelerate Canada's previous goal of 100% ZEV sales by 2040.

RATIONALE

The new timelines as proposed by Canada increased the focus on the shift to ZEVs and GHG reduction in TRCA's Fleet. Recognizing Canada's goals, staff began reviewing methodologies to reduce TRCA GHG emissions, including the adoption of ZEV technologies (battery electric, or plug-in hybrid electric) and alternative fuels (hybridization, and biofuel). The Fleet Decarbonization Policy will assist TRCA in navigating its fleet lifecycle and procurement practices for the On-Highway Fleet to align with Canada's ZEV targets for 2035, and to decarbonize the Off-highway equipment and Marine Fleet.

During our review of ways to reduce GHG emissions, the primary focus was on the Onhighway fleet, due to limited market technology from manufacturers for Off-Highway equipment and Marine industries. This lens allowed staff to identify fleet assets at a granular level as it relates to lifecycle replacement, ZEV models available from manufacturers, and their corresponding market availability (projected timing of release). Based on the timelines provided by Canada and TRCA's current On-Highway Fleet inventory and life cycles, approximately 60% of TRCA's Fleet could be electrified post 2035 barring any significant changes to project and program operations and their demand of Fleet resources.

Automotive manufacturers have taken measurable steps towards the electrification of their products within recent years. Most notably, it appears as if several manufacturers are scheduled to have electrified options across most vehicle segments up to and including light duty passenger trucks such as Ford F150, Chevrolet Silverado, GMC Sierra, Ram 1500 etc. Light-duty passenger trucks operated within TRCA's Fleet currently account for approximately 35% of active On-Highway Fleet inventory and 25% of annual GHG emissions, which represents a significant opportunity for reduction of GHG emissions within TRCA.

Regarding the Off-highway equipment and Marine Fleet, due to the limited market technology and requirement for diesel fuel in many of these categories alternative fuel adoption has been incorporated into the strategy. Specifically, fleet that operates with blended biodiesel (B20) is being procured for new assets, and the blend ratios can be adjusted over time to increase the biogenic portion to further GHG emissions reduction. Additionally, the inventory of bulk transfer tanks at TRCA facilities provides staff the ability to access refueling facilities on site to ensure compliance with a requirement for blended biodiesel. In conjunction with the above, electrification technologies within the Off-highway segments will be investigated for feasibility of adoption in projects and programs, as and when available, to ensure minimal service disruption to TRCA projects and programs.

With respect to electric infrastructure, through the Peel Climate Change Partnership

(PCCP) - including Region of Peel (Peel), City of Brampton (Brampton), Town of Caledon (Caledon), City of Mississauga (Mississauga), Credit Valley Conservation (CVC) and TRCA - the minimum threshold for the Natural Resources Canada (NRCan) Zero Emission Vehicle Infrastructure Program (ZEVIP) was met. This resulted in the PCCP successfully applying and receiving funding for implementing several EV charging stations throughout Peel. By way of this partnership with PCCP, TRCA secured funding to support the installation of EV chargers at the following locations.

- Boyd Field Office 1 x dual wand Level 2 EV charger (total of two charging stalls),
- Restoration Services Center 1 x dual wand Level 2 EV charger (total of two charging stalls),
- Black Creek Pioneer Village Parking Lot 2 x dual wand Level 2 EV chargers (total of four charging stalls)
- New Head Office (5 Shoreham Drive) 6 x dual wand Level 2 EV chargers and 1 x Level 3 EV charger (total of 13 charging stalls)

Furthermore, TRCA intends to add further EV charging stations to realize it's electrification vision and align with Canada's ZEV targets for 2035.

FINANCIAL DETAILS

The Corporate Fleet program is funded through various operating accounts for capital and operating expenditures, whereas revenues are received via internal recoveries from projects and programs who operate fleet.

DETAILS OF WORK TO BE DONE

Implementation of TRCA's Fleet Decarbonization Policy through the following actions:

- Development and corresponding approval of multi-year budget planning (10 years), with annualized budgets including 15% contingency allowance for capital expenditures.
- Implementation of required usage of blended biodiesel containing a minimum of 20% biogenic component to 80% petroleum blend (B20) for all TRCA owned Off-Highway Equipment.
- Engage with third party equipment rental suppliers of which TRCA regularly engages to discuss feasibility of blended biodiesel use in rental equipment when rented by TRCA.

1. Purpose

1.1. The purpose of this Policy is to outline the process of decarbonization of Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (TRCA) fleet assets and to manage the reduction of Green House Gas (GHG) emissions while mitigating impacts to project and program operations.

2. Scope

2.1. This document establishes the guidelines, methodology and targets to decarbonize TRCA on and off-highway fleet and local project and program related equipment.

3. Policy

- 3.1. TRCA's on-highway vehicle fleet will consist of, at minimum, 50% alternative fuel sources including Battery Electric Vehicles (BEV), Hybrid Electric Vehicle (HEV), or Plug-in Hybrid Electric Vehicle (PHEV) by end of 2030.
- 3.2. TRCA's on-highway light duty fleet will be comprised of 100% zero emission vehicles by 2045.
- 3.3. Where practical and when available budget exists, TRCA's medium and heavy-duty vehicles will be configured to utilize alternative fuels where practical provided there are minimal to zero impacts to project and program operations and/or there are alternative fuel systems available from major manufacturers.
- 3.4. TRCA's off-highway equipment fleet will at minimum be powered through 25% alternative fuels by 2030.
- 3.5. TRCA's off-highway equipment fleet will at minimum be powered through 50% alternative fuels by 2040.

POLICY NO.: CS-5.32-P

4. Responsibility

4.1. The **Program Manager**, **Fleet** is responsible for:

- The procurement of Corporate Fleet in a manner that complies with this Policy;
- b. Establishing acquisition budgets with a focus on greening TRCA's Corporate Fleet;
- c. Overseeing TRCA's Electric Vehicle Supply Equipment (EVSE) and in a manner which is consistent across TRCA facilities to ensure adequate supply for recharging of TRCA's electrified Fleet;
- d. Coordinating with the Contract Services and Asset Maintenance team for the installation of EVSE at TRCA facilities as required; and
- e. Assisting TRCA project and programs, when required, with the procurement of local equipment which complies with this Policy.

4.2. Contract Services and Asset Maintenance staff are responsible for:

- Coordinating with the Program Manager, Fleet for the installation of EVSE equipment within TRCA facilities to support recharging of TRCA Fleet as required; and
- Facilitating and administration of contracts related to the supply and installation of EVSE within TRCA facilities as and when required to support adoption of an electrified Fleet.

4.3. Supervisors to whom Equipment and Fleet is assigned are responsible for:

a. Ensuring appropriate alternative and/or bio-based fuels are procured for TRCA off-highway equipment as outlined in this policy to support the greening of TRCA's off-highway equipment Fleet.

4.4. **Facility Managers** are responsible for:

- a. Ensuring that local equipment procured to support their projects and programs comply with this Policy;
- Identification of areas within their facilities which are suitable for the supply and installation of EVSE for TRCA Fleet and or public use; and
- c. Coordinating with Program Manager Fleet and Contract Services and Asset Maintenance staff as required for the facilitation and administration of contractors for the supply and installation of EVSE.

4.5. **Asset Management Planning and Performance** (AMPP) staff are responsible for:

a. Reviewing the end of lifecycle assets and schedule replacement based on a number of factors including but not limited to projected/program demand, lifetime net revenue, projected replacement costs for the upcoming fiscal year etc.;

b. Reviewing the end of lifecycle assets with the receiving projects and programs to identify desired configuration of new fleet and identify alternative fuel technologies for the fleet classification to guide the reduction of emissions within TRCA Fleet; and

- c. Reviewing the mandatory capacities including but not limited to towing, seating, drivetrain, aftermarket equipment upfitting with the project or program which is receiving the new fleet asset.
- 4.6. On advice of the Chief Executive Officer, TRCA may accept, revise, or rescind this Policy.

5. Procedure

TRCA Owned On-Highway Vehicles

- 5.1. The lifecycle replacement of TRCA's on-highway Fleet, will prioritize the adoption of alternative power sources including Battery Electric Vehicles (BEV), Hybrid Electric Vehicle (HEV), or Plug-in Hybrid Electric Vehicle (PHEV).
- 5.2. Analysis of the project and program requirements will outline the most ideal alternative power sources based on desired vehicle configuration to minimize impact to project and program operations.
- 5.3. Pending desired alternative fuel supply for new vehicle fleet, additional infrastructure must be installed and or available at project and program work locations to ensure refueling/recharging is available as required.
- 5.4. Where no alternative power sources exist for the required classification of licensed motor vehicle, AMPP staff will investigate aftermarket hybrid solutions where possible and financially practical, pending available budget.
- 5.5. Should no alternative power sources be available for the required classification of fleet and no aftermarket hybrid solutions exist, AMPP staff will consult with the end users to determine the most appropriate power system and lowest emissions.
- 5.6. To ensure service and repair including warranty work, TRCA will only consider aftermarket hybrid solutions from non-startups whose systems do not affect or impact the original equipment manufacturer (OEM) warranty schedule for the vehicle in which the system is installed on.
- 5.7. Where possible and budget exists, the most fuel-efficient power sources will be selected over Internal Combustion Engine (ICE) vehicles provided the alternative power sources do not impact project and program operations.

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TRCA Owned Off-Highway Equipment

- 5.8. At time of acquisition, planning of Fleet assets at end of serviceable life and/or new acquisition pending available budget and current support infrastructure, alternative fuel sources should be prioritized over conventional petroleumbased fuels to assist in the reduction of GHG emissions of TRCA fleet and to assist in the reduction of operating expenditures.
- 5.9. From time-to-time, alternative fuel sources may not be available from common Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEM), in which case the procurement lead should consult with the Supervisor and to ensure appropriate selection.
- 5.10. Where there are no available alternative fuel/power systems from common OEMs, and conventional petroleum-based fuels are required, preference should be made for biofuels to minimize GHG emissions of TRCA Fleet.
- 5.11. During lifecycle planning and determination of project and program requirements for new or replacement fleet, pending available budget, the most fuel-efficient power sources with the lowest GHG emissions will be preferred over alternatives.
- 5.12. Where the intended power source is petroleum-based fuels, either by lack of available technology from common manufacturers or through desired configuration to meet project and program requirements, the off-highway equipment should at minimum be compatible with biofuel where possible and preference should be made for the lowest GHG emissions.
- 5.13. In cases where the only options in the market or industry are either 2-stroke or 4-stroke ICE, procurements for new Fleet or local project and program related equipment shall be of 4-stroke ICE equipment only, to further reduce GHG emissions.

Rental Vehicles

- 5.14. When rental vehicles are procured for TRCA, preference should be made for alternative power systems including but not limited to HEV, BEV or PHEV over conventional ICE vehicles.
- 5.15. Where alternative power systems are not available due to vehicle configuration, vehicle classification or other factors including but not limited to towing capacity, payload etc. conventional ICE power systems are permitted, and preference should be made for lower GHG emissions where practical or available.
- 5.16. Where possible rental vehicles should be sized appropriately given the intended project and program requirements to minimize consumption of fuels.

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Rental Equipment

5.17. Where off-highway equipment is procured through equipment rental agencies staff shall make best efforts to ensure the rental equipment procured for the project and program requirements is compatible with alternative fuels i.e., biodiesel blends ranging from B20 – B100 to further assist in the reduction of GHG emissions.

Biofuel

- 5.18. Where new Fleet is required to operate on diesel fuel either due to lack of available alternatives or alternative technology not adopted in the category/class of vehicle or equipment, the new Fleet asset must have the capacity to operate on a blended B20 biodiesel at minimum following the below blended biodiesel compositions at the pre-determined intervals listed;
 - Off-highway diesel powered Fleet must be capable of operating on B20 blended biodiesel as of 2023, a minimum blend of B50 as of 2035 and B100 by 2045; and
 - b. On-highway diesel powered motor vehicle Fleet must be capable of operating on a blended B20 biodiesel and must be procured when available at public fuel outlets.
- 5.19. Should hybrid or electric powertrains not be available in the intended classification for on-highway vehicles operating on petroleum-based gasoline, the new Fleet asset must have the capacity to operate on ethanol blended biofuels i.e., E85 when available and where available at public fuel outlets.

6. Definitions

- 6.1. "Alternative Fuel" means alternative power systems including but not limited to hybrid electric, plug-in hybrid electric, battery electric, biofuel.
- 6.2. "Battery Electric Vehicle (BEV)" means a type of electric vehicle that exclusively uses chemical energy stored in rechargeable battery packs, with no secondary source of propulsion.
- 6.3. "Biodiesel" means fuel produced from oils or fats using transesterification and is the most common biofuel, and can be used in its pure form (B100) or in a blended form i.e., B5, B10, B20, B50 etc.
- 6.4. **"Biofuel"** means a fuel that is produced through contemporary processes from biomass rather than by the very slow geological processes involved in the formation of fossil fuels. The most common types of biofuels are bioethanol and biodiesel.
- 6.5. **"Biomass"** means plant or animal material used as fuel to produce electricity or heat i.e., wood, energy crops and waste from forests, yard or farms.
- 6.6. **"Bioethanol"** means an alcohol-based fuel made through the fermentation of carbohydrates typically produced from sugar or starch crops i.e., corn, sugarcane, or sweet sorghum. Ethanol can be used as fuel for vehicles in its pure form (E100) or in a blended form i.e., E85.

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6.7. **"Corporate Fleet"** means any fleet asset as defined by the Tangible Capital Asset policy including but not limited to motor vehicles (owned, rented, leased), off-road vehicles, motorized snow vehicles, or equipment used for landscaping, agriculture, construction, industrial and marine vessels that is managed by the Asset Management Program staff and is used in the conduction of TRCA business.

- 6.8. **"Electric Vehicle Supply Equipment (EVSE)"** is dedicated equipment used for the supply of electrical energy for the purpose of recharging electric powered vehicles and equipment.
- 6.9. **"Four Stroke Engine (4 Stroke)"** means a type of internal combustion engine where a complete power cycle requires four strokes of the piston. This type of internal combustion engine is the most common type and is commonly found in vehicles, equipment, marine and aircraft engines.
- 6.10. "Greenhouse Gas (GHG)" means a gas that absorbs and emits radiant energy within the thermal infrared range, causing the greenhouse effect. The primary greenhouse gases are water vapor(H₂0), carbon dioxide (CO₂), methane (CH₄), nitrous oxide (N₂O) and ozone (O₃).
- 6.11. "Gross Vehicle Weight (GVW)" means the maximum allowable weight permitted to be carried on or within a vehicle which is calculated by the sum of the maximum weight ratings for all axles on the vehicle.
- 6.12. "Hybrid Electric Vehicle (HEV)" means a vehicle which combines a conventional Internal Combustion Engine (ICE) system with an electric propulsion system. The inclusion of the electric powertrain is intended to achieve either better fuel economy than an ICE Vehicle or better performance.
- 6.13. "Internal Combustion Engine (ICE)" means a vehicle which utilizes heat generated through the combustion of an air fuel mixture in a combustion chamber to resulting in high-temperature and high-pressure gases to apply force to apply force to a component of the engine. This force moves a component of the engine, transforming chemical energy into kinetic energy.
- 6.14. "Light Duty Vehicle (LDV)" means a passenger car, van and light duty trucks including Class 1 and Class 2a trucks and having a GVW of < 3,856 kgs.
- 6.15. "Local Project & Program Equipment" means any asset not within the Asset Management Program Equipment that is used in conjunction with local projects, programs, and other field operations, including but is not limited to Tools and Portable Power Equipment.
- 6.16. "Medium Duty Vehicle (MDV)" means a vehicle having a GVW of ≥ 3,856 kgs but ≤ 8,845 kgs.
- 6.17. "Heavy Duty Vehicle (HDV)" means a vehicle having a GVW of > 8,845 kgs.
- 6.18. "Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM)" means the original manufacturer of the Equipment, vehicle, portable power Equipment and/or Tools.

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- 6.19. **"Procurement Lead"** means an individual assigned to ensure a procurement process is conducted in compliance with legislative requirements supported by TRCA's policies and procedures. In most cases the procurement lead will be the project manager and will be assigned the role of Authorized Buyer. TRCA's Finance business unit, in consultation with Directors and the Chief Financial and Operating Officer (CFOO), manages the approved list of Authorized Buyers.
- 6.20. Plug-In Hybrid Electric Vehicle (PHEV)" means an electric vehicle whose battery pack can be recharged by plugging a charging cable into an external electric power source, in addition, internally through its on-board internal combustion engine powered generator.
- 6.21. **"Two Stroke Engine (2 Stroke)"** means a type of internal combustion engine that completes the power cycle with two strokes of the piston in one power cycle. The power cycle being completed in one revolution of the engine crankshaft.

KEY ISSUE

Award of Award of contract for Uniformed Security Services for various Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (TRCA) locations 2023-2027.

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT the contract for uniformed security services for TRCA public use facilities, campgrounds, offices and select properties for February 1, 2023 – January 31, 2027 be awarded to Security Guard Group, at a total cost not to exceed \$892,020, plus 15% contingency, plus HST, it being the highest ranked proposal meeting TRCA specifications;

THAT an option for a one-year extension (February 1, 2027- January 31, 2028) at the discretion of TRCA staff be available at an additional cost not to exceed \$223,005, plus 15% contingency, plus HST;

THAT should TRCA staff be unable to achieve an acceptable contract with the abovementioned proponent, staff be authorized to enter into and conclude contract negotiations with other Proponents that submitted proposals, beginning with the next highest ranked proposal meeting TRCA specifications;

AND FURTHER THAT authorized TRCA officials be directed to take whatever action may be required to implement the contract, including the obtaining of necessary approvals and the signing and execution of any documents.

BACKGROUND

It is a priority of TRCA to ensure that its facilities, staff and visitors are effectively protected from unauthorized entry, threatening behavior and vandalism during and after regular operating hours. In order to achieve this goal, uniformed security services are required to act as a deterrent and to handle situations that threaten facilities and occupants. There are two types of services required by TRCA: Annual Services performed daily from January - December and Seasonal Services performed between April - October.

Annual Services (January - December)

- A. Black Creek Pioneer Village daily scheduled security guard service
- B. Mobile Alarm Response Services at various TRCA Facilities and Conservation Areas
- C. Special Event Security Services scheduled guard, on-call "as required" shifts
- D. Spot Check Services to TRCA facilities, properties and locations

Seasonal Security Services (April – October) provided based on scheduled shifts as required by TRCA

- A. TRCA Campground Facilities:

RATIONALE

Request for Proposals (RFP) # 10038755 was posted on the public procurement website biddingo.com on November 2, 2022, with proposals received from the following firms:

- Security Guard Group
- Neptune Security Services Inc.

Proposals were opened by the Procurement Opening Committee on November 28, 2022. A Selection Committee of TRCA staff reviewed the proposals. The criteria used to evaluate and select the recommended firm included the following:

The scoring was completed by each member of the evaluation committee, and averaged to produce total scores as follows:

Based on the Selection Committee's review of the proposals, Security Guard Group was evaluated as the highest by the committee. Therefore, staff recommends that Contract# 10038755 for February 1, 2023 - January 31, 2027 be awarded to Security Guard Group with an option for a one-year extension at the discretion of TRCA staff.

Security Guard Group demonstrated qualifications and expertise as a leader in the security services field. Their corporate protocols and documentation showcase a streamlined and professional organization with appropriate policies and communication channels. They also demonstrated a thorough understanding and ability to meet the contract and scope of work requirements.

KEY ISSUE

Receipt of Toronto and Region Conservation Authority's (TRCA) unaudited revenues and expenditures as of the end of the third quarter, September 30, 2022, for informational purposes.

RECOMMENDATION

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT the 2022 Financial Report for the nine-month period ending September 30, 2022, be received.

BACKGROUND

As part of TRCA's financial governance procedures, staff are presenting the 2022 Nine Month Financial Report, which covers the period from January 1, 2022, through to September 30, 2022. This report provides information on the spend rate of expenditures and recognition of revenue for the first nine months of 2022. For the purposes of this report, TRCA's four categories of revenue have been combined into one category titled 'Revenue' in the attached financial charts, and includes:

- Authority Generated: Revenues raised through activities such as user fees, retail, rentals, program fees, event fees, and investment and interest income.
- Government Funded: Municipal, federal and provincial grants and contract services.
- Levies: Operating and Capital levies from municipal partners.
- Reserves: Accumulated *surplus* which is intended to finance unforeseen costs related to ongoing operations or unfunded *capital expenses* for the organization.

RATIONALE

TRCA believes in transparency and accountability for its spending, revenue recognition and performance of service delivery objectives against approved budgets, for both the organization and for each project and program as an individual endeavor. This is further supported by TRCA's core values of integrity, collaboration, accountability, respect, and excellence. TRCA recognizes that all projects and programs offered have cost implications and that all costs incurred are reasonable and practical in support of services. Transparency throughout the budget management process is achieved in part through the analysis and reporting on year-to-date revenues/expenses as compared to the current fiscal year budget. To improve the accuracy in reporting anticipated issues in expenditures, TRCA established a seasonal forecasting baseline using historical data from the past three years to estimate the seasonal variances within each program area.

FINANCIAL DETAILS

The capital and operating report by Service Area and underlying Program Areas are provided in **Attachments 1-4** respectively. The attachments provide a summary analysis of expenditures and revenues to date and the variance explanations by Program Area. The variance threshold for both revenues and expenditures are +/- 10% and \$500,000 from anticipated. Variances within these thresholds are deemed to be within the expected range. Variances within these thresholds are deemed to be within the expected range. The capital expenditure report contains eleven (11) and six (6) revenue reportable variances for the nine-month period, whereas the operating expenditure report contains seven (7) expenditure and four (4) revenue reportable variances. **Attachment 5** provides explanations for each reportable variance.

DETAILS OF WORK TO BE DONE

As TRCA's financial governance procedures and systems continue to evolve over time, internal processes for in-year billing from vendors, invoicing of customers and recognition of deferred revenue/internal recoveries will become a greater area of focus for the organization.

CAPITAL REPORTABLE VARIANCE NOTES

А	The lower than anticipated expenditures are related to staff advancing contracts for specialized implementation in Q3 and Q4 at multiple project sites that includes: Ashbridges Bay Landform, German Mill's Settlers Park, Gaffney Park, Hudson Drive and others. A significant portion of the underspent amount is tied to work at Ashbridges Bay that encountered unanticipated delays due to weather and environmental compliance requirements that will be completed in late 2022 and early 2023. Construction is underway by contractors at German Mills, Gaffney, and other locations that will increase expenditures by the end of 2022 and any remaining work will be completed early next year. Once these are taken into account, the variance \$3.8M and 6% which is within the acceptable threshold.
В	The lower than anticipated expenditures are as a result of Mayfield Phase 2 not being initiated during 2022 staff are in discussion with Town of Caledon to potentially phase work into 2023. Once this is taken into account, the variance \$466k and 19% which is within the acceptable threshold.
С	The Humber Bay Park East Revitalization Project is multi-year fee for service project for the City of Toronto that was initiated in Q3 2021 and extends until Q2 2024. TRCA has completed the core of its earthworks and pond naturalization and will continue with planting and final restoration in Q2 of 2023. Large value tenders for the boardwalk and bridges, and the electrical and pumping system have been awarded and are underway resulting in significant expenditures in Q4 of 2022, and will be complete by the end of Q2 of 2023. Once this is taken into account, the variance \$1M and 9% which is within the acceptable threshold.
D	The lower than anticipated expenditures are related to fewer than expected land acquisitions in in Greenspace Securement in 2022. Once this is taken into account, the variance \$240k and 30% which is within the acceptable threshold.
E	The lower than anticipated expenditures are related to delays in the detailed design process for the Scarborough Waterfront Project resulting from ongoing technical challenges and private property acquisition negotiations, led by City of Toronto staff, with affected landowners. Once this is taken into account, the variance \$471k and 8% which is within the acceptable threshold.
F	The lower than anticipated expenditures are related to changes in scope of work for a number of contracted service trail infrastructure projects including: the Nashville Conservation Reserve Multi-Use Trail, Governor's Bridge Lookout and Cudmore Creek Trail Head. The Nashville project (Accessible Trail and Parking Area) is currently on hold, due to an implementation funding gap identified through the most recent Construction Services construction cost estimate based on the finalized detailed design drawings. Cudmore Creek budget allocation for 2022 includes planning and implementation. Significant delays in securing a Hydro One permit have impacted the implementation start date; therefore, a majority of the implementation budget will be rolled over to 2023. Governor's Bridge implementation is currently on hold due to funding constraints identified by the City of Toronto. Once these are taken into account, the variance \$833k and 9% which is within the acceptable threshold.
G	The lower than anticipated expenditures are related to the deferral of site improvements at Bolton Camp until sufficient funding is secured. Once this is taken into account, the variance \$435k and 13% which is within the acceptable threshold.
Н	The lower than anticipated expenditures are related to multiple programs including Community Transformation, Partners in Project Green and Urban Agriculture. Community Transformation that had in-year changes to their scope of work. Partners in Project Green had staff gapping and the development of a new on-site stormwater management program for the ICI sector was delayed, but will launch in 2023. In addition the transition of a large in person event to virtual resulted in reduced expenditures. Additionally there were delays with tendering for infrastructure updates in Urban Agriculture that will be remediated by Q4. Once these are taken into account, the variance \$499k and 13% which is within the acceptable threshold.

I	The lower than anticipated expenditures relate to the development of the Claireville North Multi-Use Trail, which are expected to be incurred in Q4 of 2022 with remaining funds to be deferred 2023. Additionally, there was staff gapping and community engagement events that were delayed over the past two years due to COVID. TRCA staff will be meeting with municipal partners in early 2023 to ensure alignment of deliverables. Once these are taken into account, the variance \$439k and 20% which is within the acceptable threshold.
J	The lower than anticipated expenditures are related to TRCA's New Administrative Office, Asset Management, Claireville Water Service and staff gapping. Over the period of March to June 2022 multiple labour disputes related to the New Administrative Office disrupted construction activities onsite resulting in further delays to schedule. Claireville had delays in permits that have been rectified and substantial completion is anticipated by end of Q4. Once these are taken into account, the variance \$3M and 10% which is within the acceptable threshold.
К	The higher than anticipated variance is a result of timing as health and safety training and staff development for Restoration and Infrastucture will be offset Q4. Once this is taken into account the variance is \$5k and 8% which is within the acceptable threshold.
L	Revenue is lower than anticipated primarily due to lower than projected expenditures at Ashbridges Bay Landform. The original 2022 estimate assumed that the breakwater contract completed by a third-party would be \$16 million but current projections have this closer to \$8.5 million by the end of the year. This was due to weather impacts, fishery concerns, and extremely low late summer/fall Lake Ontario water levels. Once this is taken into account, the variance \$6M and 9% which is within the acceptable threshold.
М	Revenue is lower than anticipated due to Humber Bay Park East Revitalization project being a multi-year fee for service project, with work being pushed to future years Once this is taken into account, the variance \$1.6M and 9% which is within the acceptable threshold.
N	Revenue is lower than anticipated due to delays in real estate closings. \$1.1M in revenue is to be received prior to end of Q4 from limiting distance agreement and an easement. Once this is taken into account, the variance \$411k and 32% which is within the acceptable threshold.
0	Revenue is higher than anticipated due to a higher deferral of 2021 funds into 2022 due to delays with implementation of the Albion Hills Master Plan workshop which has substantial completion anticipated by 2023. Once this is taken into account, the variance \$408k and 10% which is within the acceptable threshold.
Р	Revenue is lower than anticipated due to changes in project scope and delays in projects proceeding to implementation including Cudmore Creek, Governor's Bridge Lookout, Claireville and Nashville. Once these are taken into account, the variance \$1.1M and 8% which is within the acceptable threshold.
Q	Revenue is lower than anticipated due to due to timing of loan draw for TRCA's New Administrative Office noted above. Once this is taken into account, the variance \$2.5M and 9% which is within the acceptable threshold.

KEY ISSUE

Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (TRCA) annual report on the 2023 municipal budget update.

RECOMMENDATION:

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT the 2023 Municipal Budget Update, be received.

BACKGROUND

The process for TRCA's 2023 budget has commenced. Each year, TRCA's partner municipalities require that 1-year and 4-year capital budget projections be provided, with each municipality having its own requirements and format for this information.

TRCA staff regularly consult with partner municipal staff to ensure that there is alignment on objectives and deliverables; to avoid duplication of effort; to coordinate activities and procurements to realize maximum value and efficiency; and to report on the achievement of project deliverables.

RATIONALE

Municipal Capital Funding

Regional Municipality of Durham

Durham Region budget guidelines have not been provided at this time. TRCA will be requesting a 2023 funding envelope in the amount of \$1.218 million, which compares to \$1.140 million in 2022. The increase reflects a 7% adjustment on the base; rationale for the adjustment includes inflation (2%) and the transition of watershed wide TRCA programs (Watershed Planning and Reporting, Regional Watershed Monitoring and Ecosystem Science) to a formula-based funding model that had been previously covered through contract services for Durham-specific projects. This funding is distributed on a land area basis for programs that are jurisdiction wide.

Regional Municipality of Peel

Annually, Peel Region provides an approximate 3% increase to the funding envelope from the previous year. Peel Region's 2023 funding envelope is anticipated to be in the amount of \$18.1 million, which compares to \$17.6 million in 2022. The budget reflects a 2.5% increase on the base, and it is consistent with the 2023 targets contained in the 2022 submission.

City of Toronto

City of Toronto guidance for the TRCA 2023 budget submission results in an amount of \$30.6 million for the capital budget, which compares to the 2022 approved capital budget of \$25.9 million. The 18% increase in 2023 funding is primarily driven by enhanced funding in the Water Risk Management and Tourism and Recreation service areas. City of Toronto capital funding is supported by debt financing and the Water Rate.

Regional Municipality of York

York Region's 2023 funding envelope is anticipated to be in the amount of \$6.8 million, which compares to \$5.2 million in 2022. The \$1.6 million increase is due to the Erosion Monitoring and Maintenance Program in the Water Risk Management service area. Funding for this program was enhanced over a ten-year period beginning in 2021 as well as an adjusted cashflow to meet the requirements of a successful Disaster Mitigation and Adaptation Fund (DMAF) project.

Operating Levy

The operating levy anticipated funding envelopes for the regional municipalities of Durham, Peel and City of Toronto are in line with the amounts proposed in the multi-year targets for TRCA, and approximate recent historical average increases.

With the City of Toronto's catch-up payments completed (2022), the regional imbalance of TRCA's non-CVA levy was with the Region of York. To address the remaining funding imbalance, York Region's funding envelope has been increased.
