# 9.2 SHARED ACCESS AND OWNERSHIP MODELS FOR OUT-OF-CLASSROOM LEARNING

WHEREAS the Natural Science and Education Committee (NSEC) has a mandate to study and make recommendations related to the long-term provision of out-of-classroom learning related to natural science, conservation and the environment;

AND WHEREAS the Outdoor Education Task Force (OETF), comprised of school board trustees, members of TRCA's Board of Directors and youth representatives, made a recommendation to Advance Shared-Ownership

and Access Models That Enhance and Sustain an Overall Out-Of-Classroom Learning System (Recommendation #4);

AND WHEREAS at Meeting #3/22 held on June 6, 2022, NSEC endorsed a series of minimum standards for student access to out-of-classroom learning related to natural science, conservation and the environment;

AND WHEREAS Recommendation #4 of OETF: Advance Shared-Ownership and Access Models That Enhance and Sustain an Overall Out-of-Classroom Learning System will require enhanced collaboration amongst public-sector bodies to ensure student access to learning opportunities;

AND THAT TRCA staff provide a more detailed report on governance and ownership structures for Cooperatives and Consortiums:
