
TRCA Overview

About TRCA


- Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (TRCA) is one of 36 Conservation Authorities in Ontario
- Conservation
 Authorities were created
 to safeguard
 and enhance the health and well being of watershed
 communities through the
 protection and
 restoration of the
 natural environment and the
 ecological services the
 environment provides.

CEO's Office

- CEO's Office represents and guides TRCA.
- Strives to strengthen relationships between TRCA, partners, and stakeholders.
- Represents TRCA on several intergovernmental and interagency committees to advance TRCA's mandate.



Corporate Services

- Support fundamental business operations (i.e., marketing and communication, events, IT, and records management, and property, assets and risk management.
- Addresses standard operating procedures, opportunities for organizational improvements.
- Responsible for budget processes with municipal partners and financial management of TRCA.



Human Resources

- Responsible for the formulation, implementation and administration of strategic human resources initiatives.
- Employee relations.
- Learning and Development opportunities for staff, including mandatory training.
- Health and safety administration.



Conservation Parks and Lands

- Operate and manage TRCA's Conservation Parks, lands and campgrounds.
- Management, protection, and sustainability of parks, trails, and activities
- Integrate recreational activity with nature and learning encompassing story-telling from pre-settlement days to present day.
- Lead parks and greenspace master and management planning processes.





Restoration and Infrastructure


- Strategic restoration guided by Integrated Restoration Prioritization (shoreline, wetland, riparian, stream, forest etc.), including wildlife habitat management, public planting events, etc.
- Forest and invasive species management
- Trail planning, construction, management and monitoring.
- Planning and implementation of erosion control projects
- Inland and Lakefill Soil Management
- Landscape design.





Policy Planning

- Review and provide input to government legislative, policy and regulatory initiatives, including municipal Official Plans, Zoning By-laws, etc.
- Updating TRCA planning and permitting policies, guidelines, procedures and regulation mapping in accordance with the Conservation Authorities Act and associated regulations.
- Technical review and input to development and infrastructure planning and permit applications.
- Responsible for TRCA's Enforcement and Compliance Program related to TRCA regulated areas, permit compliance and TRCA landholdings.





Education and Training

- Develop and deliver curriculum linked education programs
- Provide training programming to youth (Young Conservation Professionals) and newcomers (Professional Access Into Employment).
- Develop and implement neighbourhood action plans for improved sustainability and resilience (Sustainable Neighbourhood Action Program).
- Collaborate with private sector to promote adoption of sustainable business practices (Partners in Project Green).
- Coordinate and deliver environmental programs for residents and corporate groups
- Developing and running major events
- Community stewardship planting events





Regional Watershed Alliance Overview

Regional Watershed Alliance (RWA) Background and Context

- New Citizen Governance Model proposed in TRCA's Community Engagement Strategy (2017) to support more broader, deeper and inclusive citizen engagement at TRCA.
- Watershed Committees prior to RWA:
 - Don Watershed Regeneration Council
 - Etobicoke-Mimico Watersheds Coalition
 - Humber Watershed Alliance
- RWA formally launched the RWA in 2017.



RWA Goals

The RWA collaborates with TRCA staff, municipal partners, and stakeholders to advance the following goals:

- Achieve The Living City Vision of Healthy Rivers and Shorelines, Regional Biodiversity, and Sustainable Communities across TRCA's nine watersheds/waterfront and Lake Ontario;
- Advocate on regional and local environmental policy issues;
- Act as a resource to TRCA, TRCA's municipal partners and the Toronto and Region Conservation Foundation by providing advice on matters of community interest;
- Provide a platform for alignment on cross-jurisdictional priorities;
- Garner public support on environmental priorities across TRCA's nine watersheds/waterfront and Lake Ontario;
- Mobilize community support and political support at all levels of government; and
- Maximize impact through resource and data sharing.
