The Meadoway: Phase 1

On April 11, 2018 the Weston Family Foundation announced a pledge up to \$25 million, with a firm commitment of \$10 million available immediately.

Phase 1 of the project was delivered from 2018 – 2022 with an additional \$1.348M added to the grant to total \$11.348M.

Phase 1: Snapshot of Key Deliverables


- Completion of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment for the Multi-use Trail
- Construction of 2km of trail, 1 bridge and 1 boardwalk
- 83 ha of meadow habitat established and under various stages of adaptive management
- Over 10,000 people engaged through education and outreach programs



Successes

- Highland Creek trail connection opening in October 2023
- The <u>Visualization Toolkit</u> has won several awards locally and nationally
- Meadow restoration has significantly diversified insect and bird species
- TRCA has established itself as an expert in meadow revitalization and has recently released a digital publication <u>"A Blueprint for Greening</u> <u>Infrastructure Corridors"</u>
- Valuable tool for teaching about biodiversity
- Numerous college and university research projects undertaken in the corridor
- Model for corridor revitalization for other regions



Filling in the Remaining Meadow Restoration Gaps

- Section 5 currently in site preparation and seeding: 17 ha
- Remaining meadow restoration gaps in Section 3 and 6 to be seeded with native meadow species by fall 2023: 22 ha
- Total restoration will be 105 ha in the corridor by end of 2023 with adaptive management in 2024+




Filling in the Remaining Trail Gaps

Phase 1: Section 5 currently under construction, with completion in Fall of 2022:
 2km of trail, 1 bridge and 1 boardwalk
