Roles and Responsibilities



Regional Municipality of York

Service Manager, responsible for planning, development, implementation and delivery of housing and homelessness services under the *Housing Services*, *Act*, *2011*.

- 10-year housing and homelessness plan sets policy direction:
 - Increase supply of affordable and rental housing
 - Help people find and keep housing
 - Strengthen the housing and homelessness system
- Actions include emergency and transitional housing, eviction prevention programs, and outreach services



Local Community Service Providers


- Funded by all levels of government to deliver front-line services
- York Region partner



Local Municipalities

- Partner in planning and providing homelessness services
- Develop by-laws for public property
- Guide and approve plans for new developments

Proposed Goals for York Region's Homelessness Service System Plan


Homelessness Service System Plan will work towards two proposed goals and three priorities:

Strengthen Human Rights approach to guide decision making and service provision





Partnering with the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (TRCA)

- During the COVID-19 pandemic, York Region, TRCA and Blue Door partnered to provide a temporary Isolation Shelter for individuals experiencing homelessness
- The Isolation Shelter provided a safe and welcoming place to rest and recover from COVID-19
- York Region will continue to look for opportunities to collaborate with TRCA to offer programs that enable vulnerable residents to thrive



Youth Greenspace Employment and Life Skills Training Pilot Program

- Six-week program for youth ages 18 to 26
- On-the-job training and work experience in the environmental sector
- Weekly employment related workshops, such as:
 - Resume writing and interview skills
 - Employment Standards Act
 - Stress and time management
 - Developing healthy workplace relationships
- A network of TRCA colleagues to provide support and future employment references

Program Results

Four youth participants completed:

- 23 hours of on-the-job training
- 936 hours field experience
- 27 hours of employment and life skills workshops
- Planting of 1,665 trees






Youth participants gained:

- On-the-job experience
- Exposure to new career opportunities in the environmental sector
- Employment networks
- Self-confidence

- Extend program duration
- Provide a range of TRCA job types
- Broaden and expand training
- Fill existing gaps in workforce as identified by employers
- Partner with additional organizations and build employer networks
