At PPG EMC Meeting #01/2024, held on January 16, 2024, Resolution #3/24 was approved as follows:

AND FURTHER THAT the workplan be deliberated on to guide implementation strategies in the Partners in Project Green Executive Management Committee Leadership meeting on Tuesday January 16, 2024.

During the PPG EMC Leadership Meeting held on January 16, 2024, EMC Members provided additional feedback on specific aspects of the 2023-2026 Priority Areas and Workplan with direction to TRCA staff to include recommended updated language related to aspects of PPG's work.

Staff have synthesized EMC feedback and recommendations, along with previous input from individual meetings with EMC members and are providing an updated version of the Partners in Project Green 2023-2026 Priority Areas and Workplan for adoption.



Priority Action: Corporate Flood and Heat Risk

Expand service area of Corporate Flood and Heat Risk Program beyond Mississauga by working with internal and external partners to identify program funding and alternative delivery models.	 2023/24: Continue to implement Greening Corporate Grounds (GCG) program in the City of Mississauga. March 2024: Starting promotion for piloting CFHR assessments across TRCA's jurisdiction with 2-3 sites.
